The Junior Committee has some exciting new plans in place to make sure players, coaches and parents enjoy a successful and fun season.

To date 285 players have registered for the competitive season plus 14 J1/2 players and 37 J3/4 players

REGISTRATION:

We are required to nominate teams to Hockey WA by 3 March 2021. If you have not registered yet, please do so before the deadline of **Friday 26 February 2021**. If your child will not be playing in 2021, we would appreciate being advised asap.

For all J1-4 players there is still plenty of time to register so that we can establish teams and start training later in term 1.

PLAYER GRADING PROCESS FOR 2021

The purpose of grading is to form teams that are competitive in their grades and conducive to all players enjoying their hockey season. The grading process has three aspects (paper grading, training and practice/trial games) and full details are available on the club webpage (https://www.uwahockey.org.au/juniors/junior-information/). Please be aware of the following in relation to player grading;

- 1. If players have a request, the <u>player</u> should advise the age coordinator/coach at training. Note: The coordinators will liaise with parents as required. Please be aware that it is the players and not the parents who need to communicate their requests to the coordinators.
- 2. Players need to demonstrate their capabilities at training and practice games. That is up to each player. Teams have not been finalised during the practice games. Everyone has the opportunity to show their hockey skills and capabilities.
- 3. Existing friendship groups are not part of team selection criteria. The hockey club is an opportunity to develop new friendships, as well as reinforcing existing friendships. Please remember one of our objectives is (as described in the information for parents for 2021 provided on the webpage):

"provide an environment for players to develop a love for hockey and UWAHC and to establish strong lifelong friendships within the club"

PARENT SUPPORT

The club relies on parents for the success of our junior division.

We have a junior committee of 20 people who have been working hard for several months preparing for a successful season.

We are planning for 26 junior teams plus 18 teams in J1/2 and J3/4. That means 44 coaches, 44 managers and 44 umpires/umpire mentors. We need your active assistance and support to make this work.

Please help us make this job of filling all these roles as easy as possible by offering your contribution and encouraging others who you know would do a great job to volunteer.

There is lots of support available and provided to coaches, managers and umpires.

If you do not have a formal role then we need you to;

- 1. Be a cheer leader and supporter for your child's team.
- 2. Be an advocate for the UWA Hockey Club.
- 3. Support the club functions and events.

SKILLS DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

The flier has been distributed for our pre-season block of 4 skills training sessions in March. We are encouraging all juniors to enrol as this program gives you a great opportunity to improve your basic skills and get more enjoyment from your hockey season. Lots of J5/6, J7/8 & J9/10 players have registered and there are still positions for more players. We are including J11/12 players in this program.

BUNBURY CARNIVAL (5 June-7 June 2021)

The junior club has been attending the June long weekend Bunbury Carnival since we commenced juniors in 1992.

Over many years for many junior players the Bunbury Carnival is the highlight of the hockey year. A chance to get away with your hockey mates for a long weekend of hockey and fun.

We want to encourage as many players as possible to come along for the weekend and to stay in the accommodation provided by the club. You will have lots of fun, play plenty of hockey and return home exhausted on Monday afternoon. It is for J5/6 to J9/10 grades, boys and girls.

For this to be a successful weekend we need parents support including a willingness by enough parents to stay at the accommodation and enable us to provide this weekend for the junior players. We have a well-documented management plan to ensure that the weekend is a success.

TEAM FEE:

Once teams are announced we expect all players to pay a team fee. This is a once off payment, set by the club, that varies between teams and grades and covers costs that parents would normally be expected to pay weekly or at the end of the season. It provides for the following;

- 1. Turf hire charges that each turf requires when a team plays their fixture game on a turf.
- 2. Junior umpire charges junior umpires are not paid to umpire J5/6 games. However once they progress to J7/8, J9/10 and J11/12 they are paid to umpire each game.
- 3. Senior players who coach or assist to coach a junior team do not pay senior fees. In addition they are paid an allowance of \$250 for the season.
- 4. End of year gift for the team coach and manager.

COACHING SUPPORT:

This year we are introducing a standardized coaching program – "The UWA Way" and a program to help our junior players develop their hockey life skills – "The Mental Game". There is information on the webpage under the Coach Development tab (https://www.uwahockey.org.au/juniors/coach-development/). These are two exciting new initiatives for the junior division.
