The hockey club and UWA sports will be covering the total cost of the program .No contribution will be paid by participants .

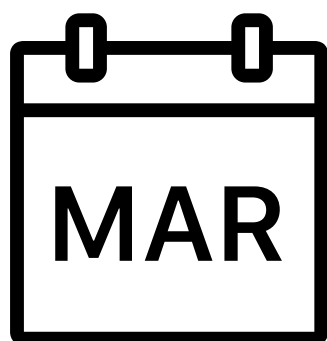
The number of participants will be limited .

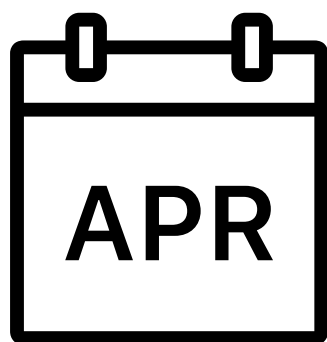
