Player Grading Process for 2022

The purpose of grading is to form teams that are competitive in their grades and conducive to all players enjoying their hockey season. The grading process has three aspects (paper grading, training and practice/trial games) – see https://cdn.revolutionise.com.au/site/x1knbhkuokzz8adr.pdf

Please be aware of the following in relation to player grading;

If players have a request, the <u>player</u> should advise the age coordinator/coach at training. Note: The coordinators will liaise with parents as required. Please be aware that it is the **players and not the parents** who need to communicate their requests to the coordinators.

Players need to demonstrate their capabilities at training and practice games. That is up to each player. Teams have not been finalised during the practice games. Everyone has the opportunity to show their hockey skills and capabilities.

UWAHC does not consider existing friendship groups as part of team selection criteria. The hockey club is an opportunity to develop new friendships, as well as reinforcing existing friendships. Please remember one of our objectives is to "provide an environment for players to develop a love for hockey and UWAHC and to establish strong lifelong friendships within the club"

The junior club has been attending the June long weekend Bunbury Carnival since 1992. It is one of the highlights of the hockey year. A chance to get away with your hockey mates for a long weekend of hockey and fun.

The Bunbury Carnival is for girls and boys in J5/6 to J9/10 grades. Last year was amazing and we want to encourage as many players as possible to come along for the weekend and to stay in the club provided accommodation. You will have lots of fun, play plenty of hockey and return home exhausted on Monday afternoon.

Parent support is crucial for this to be a successful weekend and that includes staying at the venue to look after the kids, which is a really worthwhile experience. Without appropriate support the club is unable to provide this weekend for the junior players.

Parent Accommodation: Every year accommodation is booked fast so get onto making reservations now!

Team Fee

Each player from J5/6 to J11/12 will pay a team fee in addition to the registration fee. This fee covers turf venue charges, coaches' allowance for senior players coaching a junior team or coaching goalkeepers, junior umpiring payments and end-of-season gifts.

The fee varies between teams depending on the number of turf games played and whether the team has a paid coach or not. Typically, older age groups and higher grades play more turf games, so fees are higher.

Team fees per player will be in the range below:

J5/6 \$30-\$50 per player
J7/8 \$90-\$135 per player
J9/10 \$105-\$145 per player
J11/12 \$140 per player

This will vary between grades and teams and for this reason will be collected after teams are formed. Team fees are invoiced through Revolutionise.
