### Skills Academy

Skills Academy is now in its third year and the improvement in skills across the grades really is noticeable. We've had good numbers again this season:

- 72 in pre-season sessions
- 37 in term 2
- 32 in term 3

This year an additional program commenced alongside the Senior Women. The **Junior Development Program** was offered to our division 1 squad members in J9/10 and J11/12 in boys and girls. Where Skill Academy is open to all comers and is intended to develop basic skills, the Junior Development program is intended to assist our most promising young players to develop their skills, game knowledge and physical conditioning, in preparation for moving into seniors. Additionally, it is a goal of the program to prepare players to compete at the elite level, whatever that may be.

## **Participation**

You will note that this newsletter has celebrated the high performers in the Junior Club, and while we celebrate their success, it's important to remember why we all play hockey. A guiding principle of the committee is that UWAHC is an elite club and the Junior Club has an important role in developing players that will go on and play in our Premier League teams and higher.
